

OUR PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY

- 12-month minimum commitment
- Big & Little enjoy free/low-cost activities in the community
- Volunteer must have valid driver's license and access to a reliable insured vehicle
- Include thoughtfully matched volunteers (Bigs) with children/youth (Littles).

BOTH

- Are supported by a professionally trained staff member AKA a Case Manager
- Necessitate a completed application, an interview, reference checks, and clearances
- Require a desire to build a relationship with a youth in need

SITE

- One school year minimum commitment
- Big & Little meet at a site, often a local school
- Matches are supported by an on-site BBBS staff member
- Volunteer has little interaction with his/her/their Little's parent(s)/guardian(s)

MedMentors - Long-Term Opportunity

- Mentor a high school student interested in pursuing medicine!
- Commitment is minimum one hour per month
 - Meeting times are flexible at discretion of you and mentee via Zoom (1 VH per session)
- Apply to be paired with a mentee!
 - No prerequisites other than having a minimum
 3.3 GPA



Undergraduate Research Ambassadors - Long-Term Opportunity

- Mentor other undergrads to get them involved in research!
- Time commitment around one hour per week (advising hours)
 - Great program for anyone passionate about research and mentorship

Who We Are

Conversations to Remember is a 501(c)(3) charity whose mission is to combat feelings of isolation and loneliness among senior citizens. We work with any senior citizen, including those experiencing Alzheimer's and other forms of cognitive decline, who can participate in a video call.

Volunteers with Conversations to Remember will have virtual visits with senior citizens, many of whom live in assisted living communities. These seniors are lonely, and are excited to speak with you. Each video call will have 2-3 student volunteers present. The calls will be for one hour, at the same time each week. You will only be matched for a call at a time when you are available. You must commit to continuing in the program for at least 4 months. Conversations to Remember will provide you with training and support.







Pediatric Scoliosis and Spine Surgeon, The Institute for Spine and Scoliosis

Randal R. Betz is a pediatric spine surgeon with the Institute for Spine & Scoliosis in Princeton and New Brunswick, NJ. He was previously on the staff at the Shriners Hospitals for Children in Philadelphia, where he served as the Chief of Staff from 2000-2012 and was the Medical Director of the Spinal Cord Injury Program from 1983-2014. He is board-certified in both orthopedic surgery and spinal cord injury medicine.

Betz became a member of the Scoliosis Research Society (SRS) in 1986 and served as Education Committee Chair. He started the International Meeting on Advanced Spinal Techniques in 1994. He proposed the initiation of the SRS Traveling Fellowship in 1990. He served as the senior mentor for the Scoliosis Research Society Traveling Fellows in 2013. He also served as president of the Scoliosis Research Society in 2005.

He has been honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Scoliosis Research Society, the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Spinal Injury Association, and the A. Estin Comarr Memorial Award for Clinical Service from the American Paraplegia Society.

Betz cofounded several multi-surgeon pediatric spine clinical study groups including the Harms study group and the Childrens Spine Study Group.

He is married to Betsey Betz and has four 4 children and 13 grandchildren. He enjoys fishing, golf, and skiing and sharing time with family.


